John Finney has established himself in the Boston area as a conductor of great versatility and vitality, and was appointed conductor of the Boston College Symphony Orchestra in August 1999 (at the same time receiving the title of Distinguished Artist-in-Residence at Boston College). He has conducted the Boston College Symphony Orchestra in performances of many major works, including symphonies by Beethoven, Tchaikovsky, and Dvořák. Now in his 26th year as Director of the University Chorale of Boston College, he has directed that ensemble in concerts throughout the Boston area, and in a number of the world's major cities, including Rome, Dublin, Prague, Budapest, and Vienna.

SARAH NOEMI MOMM, French Horn

Sarah Noemi Momm was born in 1996 in Freiburg, Germany. She started playing the French horn in the class of Heidwolf Arnold at the music school in Freiburg when she was six years old, and stayed there until her graduation in 2013. During high school she had the opportunity to play with several ensembles, including the Freiburger Blasorchester (wind orchestra), the Symphony Orchestra of the University of Freiburg (Akademisches Orchester), and the CJD orchestra, an all-Germany youth orchestra. She also gained experience in playing chamber music with the woodwind quintet of the music school in Freiburg. With this quintet in 2014, Sarah was awarded a second national prize in the competition "Jugend musiziert," a German music competition for young people to the age of 18. She also won a first national prize in piano in 2013.

After her graduation she began studying chemistry at the Albert-Ludwigs-Universität in Freiburg. In addition to her studies in chemistry, she began to study music at the conservatory in Freiburg in 2014 in the class of Professor Bruno Schneider. Since then she has been playing frequently in diverse ensembles of the conservatory such as the chamber orchestra, symphony orchestra and several chamber music groups.

Currently Sarah is pursuing her Masters in Chemistry and will finish her Bachelor's degree at the conservatory in Spring 2019. From September 2018 until February 2019 she had an internship in the chemistry department at Boston College. During her time in Boston she has been a member of the BC Symphony Orchestra and the Chamber Music Society. Sarah is the co-winner of the 2018-2019 Boston College Symphony Orchestra Concerto Competition.
